- > Project AWARE Arizona Department of Education Amy Castellanos, Rebecca Astorga
 - Project AWARE, Advancing Wellness and Resiliency in Education was developed as a result of the Sandy Hook school shooting, recognizing there were systems in place that were working in silos. Through the building of interconnected state- and community-level partnerships, the AWARE Team aims to promote systems integration and policy change. Project AWARE is a partnership with ADE and AHCCCS as the state mental health and Medicaid authority.
 - Infrastructure build to expand a comprehensive school mental health system; Multidisciplinary teaming to include community provider representatives.
 - The core components of a comprehensive school mental health system identified experts at the National Center for School MHTTC:
 - o Well-trained educators and specialized instructional support personnel
 - o Family-school-community collaboration and teaming

- Needs assessment and resource mapping
- o Multi-tiered system of support
- Mental health screening
- Evidence-based and emerging best practices
- o Data
- o Funding
- The School Health Assessment and Performance Evaluation (SHAPE) System is a publicaccess, web-based platform that offers schools, districts, and states a workspace, team selfassessment tools, and targeted resources to support continuous quality improvement for school mental health systems.
- Discussed Quality Indicators: Best practices guildlines for CSMH- This is used to self-assess indicators implementation and guide strategic quality improvement pnanning.
- Trauma Responsive Assessment Evidence-Informed Tool is composed of 8 Domains- Codeveloped by the National Child Traumatic Stress Network.
- Talked about the School and Behavioral Health Partnerships. Updated version by January 2023 will included the new ASBA policy for mental health referral in support of Jake's Law, or the Children's Behavioral Health Services Fund.
